Addressee

To Aurelius Cassius, priest, *archidikastes*, and officer in charge of the *chrematistai* and the other courts,

Parties

from Marcus Aurelius Herodotos and from Marcus Aurelius Sarapion, known before becoming a Roman citizen |⁵ as Sarapion, son of ... and of the deme of Althaea and (from) his co-guarantor Marcus Aurelius Hephaestas.

Agreement proper

Aurelius Sarapion agrees together with his co-guarantor Aurelius Hephaestas that he has sold to Aurelius Herodotos, the slave ... |¹⁰ at the buyer's risk(?), free from epilepsy and skin disease(?) and (he agrees that) he has received from him the established price, two thousand eight hundred silver drachmas from hand to hand (and) from the house (*in cash*), and (he agrees that) Aurelius Herodotos, now that he has received the slave woman Herakleia and has paid the statutory fee for her ... can control |¹⁵ her and lord it over her ... and can make arrangements about her ... Aurelius ...
