and from Titus Salvius Symmachos and Titus Iulius Zenon.

## Agreement proper

Salvius Symmachos agrees that he has sold with the co-guarantee of Iulius Zenon to Aphrodisios acting through Apollonides a slave girl belonging to him, called Ligyriane, now |<sup>10</sup> nicknamed Nike, from the Pontus area, said to be thirteen years old, (imported) from abroad, at the buyer's risk(?) and free from epilepsy and skin disease(?) and having been inspected in accordance withto the decrees for the price of two thousand six hundred silver drachmas, which Salvius Symmachos (agrees that he) has received |<sup>15</sup> from Apollonides both from hand to hand (*in cash*) and from the bank of Tiberius Iulius Sarapion through his assistants from the bank account of Aphrodisios, who, now that he has received the slave girl Ligyriane on the spot through Apollonides, can lord it over her from now on, just as they settled the case in the dispute.
